New Gold and the Township of Chapple

The Municipality of Chapple's agreement to transfer certain roads within the New Gold Rainy River mine site to New Gold, and the assumption by the Ministry of Transportation of certain municipal roads in connection with the relocation of Highway 600, have all worked to facilitate the development of New Gold's Rainy River mine.

New Gold has agreed to pay compensation to the Municipality for the roads, and to establish a Chapple Community Development Fund (CCDF) by providing an initial cash contribution and subsequent contributions upon commercial production.

The CCDF, which will be given oversight by Council for the Municipality, may be used to support a variety of initiatives such as land stewardship environmental sustainability development, construction of community facilities, or other permitted community related initiatives support by the Municipality.

The Township of Chapple wishes to thank New Gold for providing the Community Development Fund and their commitment to our community.

Fire Extinguisher/Fire Safety Course

Will be taking place Wednesday, October 12th,

From 6:30 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Chapple South Fire Hall on Queen Street. Maximum 15 participants. You will learn how to operate a fire extinguisher in the events of an emergency by practicing on a live fire; when to call for help; home fire escape planning; Smoke/CO home requirements.

All participants will be entered into a draw for Smoke/CO combination alarm package.

Is Your Family Prepared?

In an emergency you will need some basic supplies. You may need to get by without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours.

You may have at home some of the items already, such as a flashlight, battery-operated radio, food and water. The key is to make sure they are organized and easy to find. Would you be able to find your flashlight in the dark?

Make sure your kit is easy to carry. Keep it in a backpack, duffel bag or suitcase with wheels, in an easy-to-reach, accessible place, such as your front hall closet. Make sure everyone in the household knows where the emergency kit is.

Basic Emergency Kit

* Water – at least two (2) litres of water per person per day. Include small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order. * Food that won't spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods (remember to replace the food and water once a year). * Manual can opener. * Wind-up or battery-powered flashlight (and extra batteries). * Wind-up or battery-powered radio (and extra batteries). * First aid kit. * Special items such as prescription medications, infant formula, and equipment for people with disabilities. Don't forget pet food/supplies for your family pet. * Extra keys to your car and house. * Cash in smaller bills, such as \$10 bills and change for payphones. * A copy of your emergency plan and contact information.
