BE SURE TO PRESENT YOUR DUMP CARD!

Please remember when you are bringing garbage to the landfill that it needs to be sorted.

Garbage needs to be separated into the following categories:

Household: consists of household garbage; cement – cement blocks; large chunks of broken cement; plastics; shingles; glass; insulation; cardboard; drywall; all household furniture i.e. treated, painted, stained or upholstered furniture; plywood – OSB, press board, MDF board (anything that contains a glue product); treated construction lumber – 2x4's, etc.; EMPTY paint cans & aerosol cans; EMPTY oil containers; and insulation.

Burnable: clean wood – tree branches, brush, limbs, and leaves; construction wood – non-treated; wood pallets; wood crates; cardboard.

Metal: All metals; vehicles and all their metal parts; air conditioners – including portable, central air units – must be tagged by a qualified technician that Freon has been removed; freezers, refrigerators – must be tagged by a qualified technician that Freon has been removed.

Propane Tanks: Propane tanks must be completely empty and put in a separate area beside the metal pile.

Wire: Page wire, barbed wire, cables to be rolled and put in a separate area beside the metal pile.

Ashes: Ash must be cold – NO HOT COALS – must be dumped in the ash pile.

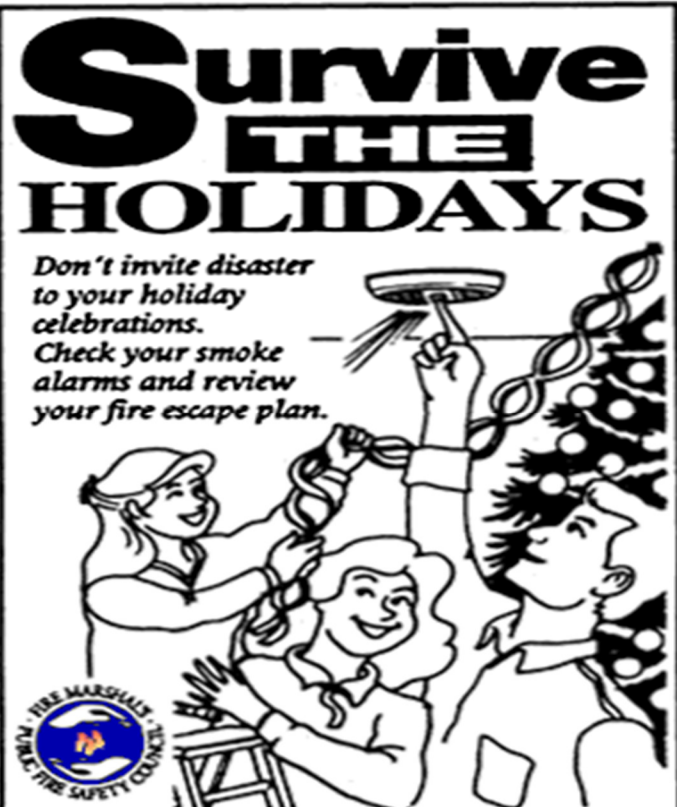
Tires: All tires regardless of the size must be put in the tire pile. Paperwork must be completed with the landfill attendant before leaving the tires at the landfill sites.

Electronics: TV's, computers, printers, tablets, etc. To be placed in the electronics bin at the Shenston Landfill site.

Creosoted wood, railway ties, bridge timbers MUST be taken to the Richardson Landfill Site ONLY – contaminated material fees apply and will be charged before dumping.

WE WILL NOT ACCEPT:

- New or used oil i.e. motor oil, hydraulic oil, etc.
- No fuel or oil tanks unless they are clean and dry
- Paint cans/aerosol cans that have paint in them
- Air conditioners or appliances with Freon in them.

Burning Permits are needed for the entire year. If you are planning on doing any burning you need to get a Burning Permit

## Do you have your winter survival kit in your vehicle?

Here are a few ideas for the trunk:

1. Sleeping bag/extra blankets
2. Spare coats, mittens, boots, hats
3. Roll of bright surveyor tape
4. Medium-sized snow shovel
5. Jumper cables
6. Tow chain
7. Tire chains (know how to put them on your vehicle!)
8. Flares
9. Gas line antifreeze (use as recommended during winter to avoid problems)
10. Gallon container of defrosting windshield fluid
11. Gallon container of premixed antifreeze
12. Vehicle repair kit (pliers, screwdriver, adjustable wrench, cable ties, wire, electrical tape, duct tape, fuses, etc.)
13. 100 ft. of parachute cord (or other "rope")
14. Bag of kitty litter for traction assistance
15. Coffee can with lid and toilet paper (emergency toilet)
16. Toilet paper/alcohol/coffee can heater
17. Tarp, bright coloured (in case you need to build shelter)



A few ideas for inside the vehicle:

1. Maps & compass.
2. Snow brush/ice scraper.
3. Flashlight and spare batteries + bulb.
4. 12 hour light sticks.
5. Drinking water (1 gal/person) (remember water expands when it freezes and may break containers if left in extreme cold).
6. High energy food (many options these days).
7. Prescription medicines.
8. Sun glasses or ski goggles.
9. Cellular phone and emergency battery and 12 v cord.
10. CB radio (or Ham radio, if you are a ham operator).
11. Small AM/FM radio + batteries.
12. Reading materials.
13. Deck of cards.
14. Hand warmers (chemical type).
15. Space blankets and tape. (To use insulate windows, not as blankets.)
16. Carbon monoxide detector.
17. Fire extinguisher.
18. Roll of paper towels.
19. Marine air horn in case you hear a rescuer who can't see you.
